The Berri Riverside Caravan Park requires a deposit of 50% to be paid by the end of November.

Hope to see you at the rally.



Army Moke

One of the vehicles that will be at our National Rally in Berri is this unique Moke. Although strictly not a Nuffield vehicle it has Nuffield/BMC lineage, an interesting history and a strong South Australian connection. John and Annette Brooksmith have kindly supplied the following information and we urge others to submit details of the vehicle they are bringing for inclusion in the next Berri Banter.

"Army Mokes are very rare ~ out of about 40,000 Mokes built only 316 went to Army service in Australia. They were designed originally only for the the UK Army, but the UK Army rejected them as being unsuitable so Leyland had to find a use for them in the civilian market and that made Mokes a cult car in the 70s. Probably no other Army bought them and there is one Army Moke in Sydney, one in Gippsland Victoria, and the rest of the remaining ones are in sheds as people say "they are rare, put them in the shed for later" ~ ours goes out and gets shown off for what it is!

Our Moke was made by Leyland in Sydney in 1975 as part of 316 Mokes made especially for the Australian Army. The Army wanted some trailers for their Moke fleet so they made 90 trailers in the Army workshops in Maribyrnong, near Melbourne around the same time. We have trailer No. 39, but we won't be bringing the trailer to the rally, but interestingly it was purchased from a Rifle Club at Berri (You must know where that is A real bit of South Australian History!) .

This Moke served with the Australian Army in Keswick SA from 1975 to 1979. The Army purchased their Mokes in 5 separate batches, and this vehicle was in the 3rd batch. There is also another from this 3rd batch, and an Army Moke trailer, in the Army Museum in Bandiana Wodonga Victoria".

Travelling within SA?

South Australian quarantine checkpoints

Quarantine stations and fruit disposal bins are strategically placed throughout South Australia. Random quarantine roadblocks can operate anytime and anywhere within the state. Anyone caught bringing fruit illegally into South Australia or the Riverland will face fines and penalties.

Visiting a vineyard?

Help keep South Australia's premium wine regions phylloxera free. Grapes, grapewines and associated products are prohibited from entering South Australia. For more information visit www.vinehealth.com.au

Providing proof

When travelling either into South Australia or within the state, proof may be required to show the Item you are carrying is from a state which is free of a particular pest or disease. Declarations and forms are available at www.pir.sa.gov.au/biosecurity/plant. health

Riverland

Do not take fresh unprocessed fruit and fruiting vegetables (including capsicum, chilli, tomato and eggplam) into the Riverland region without an itemised receipt from a South Australian retail outlet or a Plant Health Certificate.

Kangaroo Island

Do not take rabbits, bees or bee products onto the island. Potatoes are also prohibited unless they have been washed or brushed free of soil and are in new packaging.

Fruit or fruiting vegetables may only travel into South Australia's Riverland Fruit Fly Exclusion Zone if they have been purchased in SA and are travelling with an itemised receipt, or if they are accompanied by a current Plant Health Certificate.
